Student Behavior Support

Handling student behavior is a key part of creating a positive and productive environment at **your site**. By addressing behaviors thoughtfully and consistently, Site Directors can support students in making better choices while maintaining a safe and respectful atmosphere for everyone.

WE SEE YOU!

Celebrate student achievements with special events or recognition programs.

COMMON BEHAVIORS

- Minor Disagreements
- Brief conflicts that resolve quickly.
- Restlessness
- Signs of tiredness or needing a break.
- Impatience
- Brief frustration while waiting.
- Mild Disruptions
- Talking out of turn or fidgeting.
- Social Withdrawal
- Temporary disengagement from activities.

REQUIRING DOCUMENTATION

- Aggression
- Frequent hitting, kicking, or pushing.
- Emotional Outbursts
- Tantrums or prolonged crying.
- Isolation
- Consistent withdrawal from peers or activities.
- Inappropriate Language
- Offensive words or actions.
- Safety Concerns
- Behaviors that pose a risk to self or others.

EXTREMELY CHALLENGING BEHAVIORS

At AlphaBEST, the following behaviors are considered to be extreme and should be documented **EVERY TIME** they are observed:

- Eloping (running away)
- Extreme Defiance
- Physical Aggression

Refer back to the registration packet to ensure no special needs or disabilities were indicated.

At no time should ANY children in our programs have multiple (more than 3) Behavior (Incident) Reports for extreme behaviors without your Area Manager, District Manager, or Regional Director being aware.

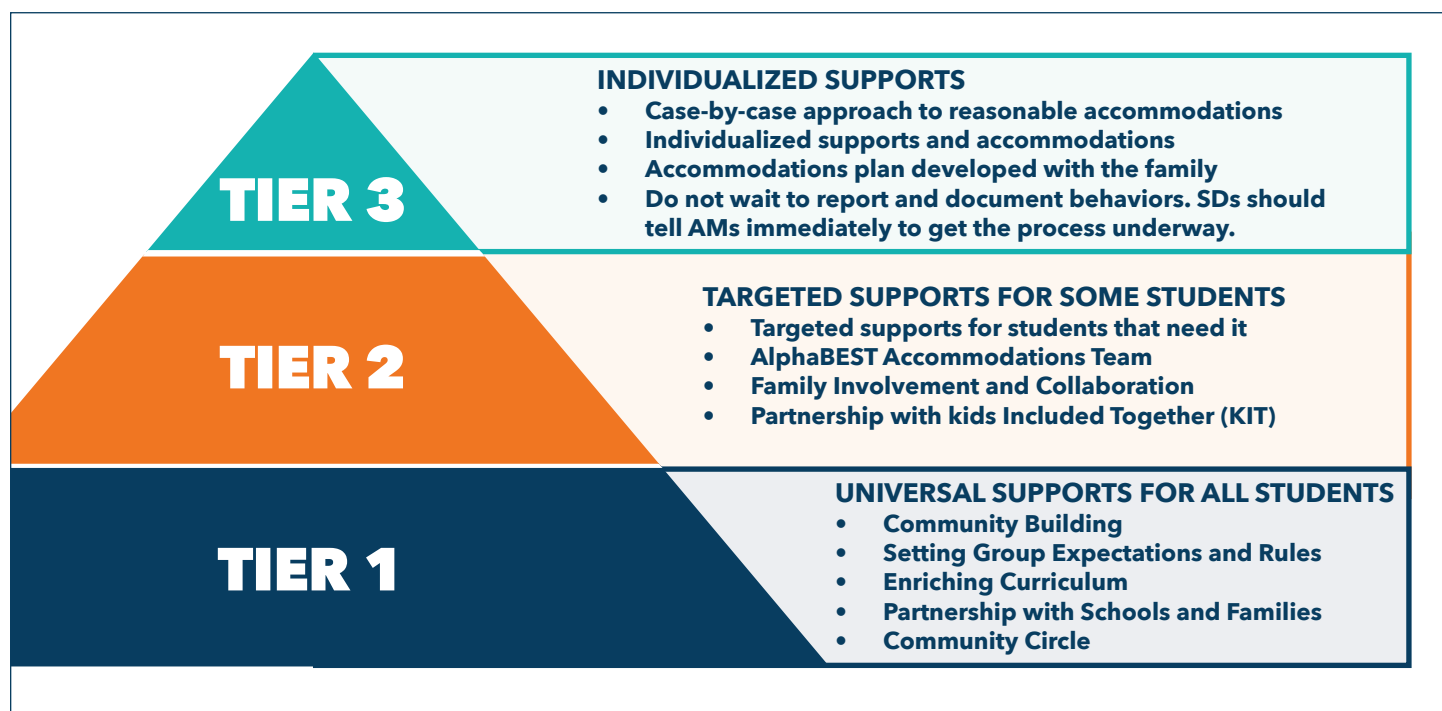
Accommodations

When a student is unable to access the environment, participate in activities, or communicate effectively, it may be time to start an accommodation plan.

An accommodation plan is a document that lists what reasonable changes will be made to remove a barrier that prevents the student from learning or getting work done.

PARENT INTERVIEW

If a parent identifies a need for an accommodation for their child OR the site team members identify a child that needs additional support within the program, the Site Director and/or Area Manager will reach out to the parent/guardian to gather additional information.



AlphaBEST has partnered with Kids Included Together (KIT) to help create accommodation plans. KIT helps to provide students with special needs opportunities to increase their skills while building on their potential. As a Site Director, you will be asked to be a part of this process.



Site Directors will have access to all student accommodation plans. Accommodations can be made for ANY child in the program if it helps them stay on task, safe, regulate themselves, etc. All behaviors need to be documented and reported to a supervisor! Please reach out for internal support so we can document this process, and follow the internal process prior to the KIT calls.
